
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

## PRESIDENT'S COLUMN, APRIL 2022 KEY KLIX

### GOLDILOCKS AND THE MERIDEN AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

In the children's tale of Goldilocks, a main issue revolved around the temperature of the Bear's porridge. One was too hot, one was too cold, and one was just right. The Bears, upon their return home, were appropriately annoyed at Ms. Locks, and they expressed their feelings to their unwanted visitor in no uncertain terms.

So, too, it is with the Business Meetings at the Meriden Amateur Radio Club. The February meeting ran for about 2 hours and 10 minutes. The Agenda was four pages and lots of members gave their input. After the meeting several other members released their electronic vitriol in my direction to show their annoyance at the length of the meeting. I received comments including statements that -----the meeting length was ridiculous; the meetings are way too long; many members have to go to bed by 9pm since they work the next day; some members have decided not to attend any more meetings since it is much too long and they will no longer participate; I liked it when in the past meetings ran for 15 minutes and then we chatted with each other over coffee like a club should; it's a hobby- it should be fun, and we don't need to discuss every net and rehash the same material; the meetings are so long there is never time for new business; we have multiple sites where reports can be viewed in Club forums and on the Reflector, etc., we can just skip over areas if there are no reports and members can read the information on-line, if they wish; we waste too much time chatting.

One member even timed the sections pointing out that roughly, a 5 minute designated discussion time ran to over 15 minutes; meetings should be 45 minutes max., etc. I am grateful for all the feedback. So, I have listened and as requested I truncated the meeting time to one hour MAX. In March I trotted it out and finished in 58 minutes --- and then the club voted to extend the session by 10 minutes to cover other issues. We skipped over several areas and although I achieved the designated end time, I felt issues were left undiscussed. Even 2 minute talks will add up with as many areas of club activity as we have at present. After the meeting, on one Net I heard members say they didn't mind they long meeting as long as it was radio-related material, and meetings should continue until all issues were addressed. All swords have two sides, and this club has multiple points of view, as well as swords.

I favor a participatory democracy. I feel strongly that club members have a **right to know what their club is doing.** A two hour meeting one a month does not seem excessive to me, but clearly it does to others. So, I consulted my inner Goldilocks and decided for April I will limit the meeting to 90 minutes 1930 – 2100 (7:30p - 9:00p) FIRM.

Perhaps this will be the "just right" porridge I so fervently seek-- perhaps not. I see club membership increasing and members becoming more involved in radio. Our current leader in this effort is Bob WB1GYZ, aka "flaps" who holds CW training classes. This is wildly successful. Should he be given 2 minutes to address his activities so that other less active club members can be made aware and join the group if they wish? Should WB1GYZ be relegated to a column in Key Klix, on the Forum, or the Reflector? Should we just say "email him for more information"??

I was voted in as your Club President in 2 free and fair elections. I have my views on MARC's potential for leadership and how it can provide the best amateur radio club experience for its members. We have been fortunate to have had about 50 new Hams join MARC over the past 1-2 years. We must be doing something right. Clearly for me a 15 minute business meeting is not very productive. Neither is assuming the membership should search out all the nooks and crannies where info can be listed. That, in large part, is what a club meeting is for. We are doing a lot and it takes time to talk about it. Regardless I will limit future meetings to no longer than 90 minutes unless the club votes to extend.

I will try harder to be efficient and while encouraging comments, I will limit ramblings and off-topic verbal excursions. I think it can be done. I want all Club members to be aware of what is going on around them---that's my style. I do a lot for MARC and rely heavily on the support of so many members. However, if the membership wishes to return to 15 minute meetings with 45 minutes for donuts and coffee, they can vote to change the leadership in the Winter. That's the way it should be. I will continue to be sensitive to the Club members' diverse needs and opinions. I love this Club and want to keep it together and have it grow stronger. Forgive me if I burn my tongue or freeze my fingers while I try to find the magical "just right" porridge. It ain't easy, so please, Bear with me.


