PRESIDENT'S COLUMN, AUGUST 2023 KEY KLIX

The President's Podium Ed Snyder W1YSM President





The Constitution Committee met 6 times during the May - June -July time frame. We had requested forseveral months that members suggest changes to the MARC Constitution and By-Laws. In total, we eceived 81 suggested changes. Some suggestions were big, and some were small. I am pleased to announce that the Committee has completed its work, and we are ready to present the fruits of our labors to the MARC membership at large. The members of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee were: - W1YSM Chair, Mike K1LHO, Joe, N1LES, Bob KE1AU, Judy W1BJG, Elsie KB1IFZ and Kristin KC1ISI. Also included were Eric KB1JL, Bart, N1BRL, Rick, KC1OYN, and Rob K1RCT.

The committee worked quite well together. The meetings were all fully attended and very productive. As we worked through the suggestions, we put the proposed changes to the Constitution and By-laws into a running Word document recorded in Track Changes. This record is what we now present to the full Club membership. The Club members will see all the track changes and another "clean" document with all of the track changes accepted, so that people easily can look through the proposed changes to determine if they approve them or not. The final vote will be to accept all the changes at once, not to vote on each individual change.

The next step will occur on Tuesday, 8 August when we will meet by hybrid (in-person/Zoom), from 7p to 9p to discuss the proposed Committee changes to the Constitution and By-laws. The proposed updated version was sent to all MARC members last week. The Town Hall process will be as follows: First I will entertain a motion to accept the new Constitution and By-Laws as proposed by the Committee. Then there will be a second. At that point I will call for the vote on the motion to be tabled (postponed) until the September business meeting. This will allow the membership to have a full discussion. I intend to walk through the Constitution and By-Laws changes, line by line, to highlight what changes were made, and why. This process, albeit tedious, will take about two hours. If necessary, another Town Hall could be held on Tuesday, 15 August from 7 to 9. The actual vote on the Constitution and By-Laws (whether to accept the proposed documents or not), will occur at the September 14th Business Meeting. We will not discuss the changes to the Constitution at the August Business meeting since there are other issues to be addressed. If the vote is to accept the proposed changes to the Constitution and By-Laws on September 14th, we will move forward under the new documents. The nominations and elections will occur with the new Constitution in place. If the Club votes down the proposed new changes, we will go back to square one and continue with the elections being held the way they were in years past. All other proposed changes also will be voided.

There are only about six or seven really notable proposed changes to the Constitution and By-laws for the membership to consider. These substantive changes were highlighted in an email sent to all club members. Key among them was the reaffirmation that the name of the club is the Meriden Amateur Radio, Club Inc., but that for the Town of Wallingford, MARC will do business as (d/b/a) the Wallingford Amateur Radio Group. Further, the Wallingford Amateur Radio Group will become a Standing Committee. This was actually voted on in 2019 but never formalized, until now. We also added another Standing Committee, that of Outreach and Community Communications. This Committee will be responsible for redesigning the MARC website and the Reflector, and dealing with a variety of other issues that present the face of the Meriden Amateur Radio Club to the outside world.

Also, and importantly, voting for officers will now be in person and electronic, and voting for the officers will occur over a 24 hour period – not just 10 minutes as it is now. By holding Town Meetings, allowing a month for discussion and sending out the material a week in advance of the first Townhall, hopefully the members will feel that their needs are being met and that their concerns are being heard.

I encourage the adoption of the new Constitution and By-Laws. but look forward to the one and possibly two Townhall meetings to discuss all the proposed changes. The Meriden Amateur Radio Club will be 150 members strong as of this coming Thursday's Business Meeting. We should be proud of the fact that we've grown from a small local club to one of the leading, if not the most active, club in the State of Connecticut. We need a Constitution that allows MARC to grow and flourish. Our members, just this year, have received three grants -- one from the ARDC and ARRL for the Marconi project, one for the Balloon Project being run by Ray KC1QLS, and one for one of our members NT1S Tyler who received a very sizeable scholarship from the AABB Foundation Board to further his studies at Yale. August 5th, we launched a balloon that went up at least 20,000 feet and eventually burst somewhere over the mid-Atlantic, with the WSPR signal being heard as far east as Great Britain.

MARC is a bit like the Roman god Janus (for whom January was named) who had two faces - one facing backward and one facing forward. We face backwards to honor and remember those who founded MARC in 1947 and we also face forward to consider what kind of a club we want to leave to future members. We need a Constitution and By-Laws that are living documents that can change with the times. For example, in 2023 we need to show support for the Town of Wallingford with WARG, just as they show support for MARC by housing us in the OEM. We need to allow electronic voting for officers and allow members reasonable time to cast their ballots. The Officers and I are very grateful for your trust and confidence in our leadership. Hopefully, most club members would agree with the direction in which we have taken the Meriden Amateur Radio Club. This had led to a remarkable 100% increase in club membership and a major increase in prominence and influence in amateur radio in the Northeast. I hope you will all attend the Town Hall in person or on Zoom, on Tuesday August 8th, from 7 to 9p when we discuss the new proposed Constitution and By-Laws and hope that you will let your voice be heard. This is your club and I am proud to be its President. MARC like Janus, needs to remember the past as we move ever-forward. Ed W1YSM President MARC

Meeting called to order at 1906L by President W1YSM.

Announcements - (W1YSM) Ed listed activities of the club, current and new. Ed discussed his key klix article "where is everyone else."

Secretary Report (KB1JL). May 2023 minutes were approved. New applicants KC1SJE and W1BRY were voted in. A thank you note from a local cub scout pack was read, regarding their visit to the club.

Treasurers Report (KIC1OYN), A detailed treasurers report was read by KC1OYN. A review of insurance policy for next fiscal period is in progress and was discussed. K1LHO, NA1L and WB1GFI are reviewing the terms of our current policy. A request for a fund of up to \$500 was requested for KC1QLS for the balloon project was approved by unanimous vote.

<u>SAM Report</u> (K1RCT) Various improvements to the station and equipment were noted by Rob. He also took and inventory of club and town equipment. Rob discussed recent POTA activations, and announced that the egg beater VHF/UHF array on a tripod has been almost completed, We also have a VHF egg beater for stationary use at the club. This will improve satellite communications.

Standing Committees (W1YSM). June 22 activity meeting will be a talk on Cape Cod radio history by K1GGI. July activity will be LITP at Marcus Cooke park. Brief reports on Technical Interference (K1RCT), Scholarship (N1ZN) and repeater (K1LHO) were given.

<u>Other activity</u> - WB1GYZ reported on CW class, K1LHO discussed contest activations and KB1IFZ/KB1EHE mentioned the IARU contest upcomingin July. Club nets were mentioned and listed. N1API reported on 10-10 with an upcoming 10 meter contest, in August . KC1ISI recapped the recent communications trailer POTA activation at Wharton Brook State Park. Several attended, and Emergency Management was happy with the success. Key Klix (K1WJL) will be coming out soon, after the ducks are washed. New Business- A motion was put forth and seconded to approve the expenditure of up to \$500 to pay N1GNV for food for Field Day and Lark in the Park. This will be voted on at July business meeting.

Other votes- Club also voted and passed a motion to approve up to \$500 to KC1QLS for balloon project. Meeting ended 2110L

<u>Secretary's Report</u> (N1BRL), Approval of the June Business Meeting Minutes was postponed until the August meeting. Four new applicants were each approved for membership. Kenneth Jalbert KB1FEX, Julian LoRusso KC1STF, Silas Moeckel K1SMD and Mark White KC1TEV. Tyler Schroder NT1S received a scholarship from the ARDC.

<u>Treasurer's Report.</u> was read by Rick KC1OYN. W1YSM received a \$50 reimbursement for the Lark in The Park deposit and KC1OYN was reimbursed \$105.21 for the in the ground VE flag. N1GNV made a \$125 donation in support of the balloon project. The complete report is available to members upon request to the Treasurer.

<u>Station Manager's Report</u> (K1RCT), The Station Activity Manager reported Saturday morning activities at the OEM include about 15 to 20 people. Issues with the Heil headsets are being evaluated and 2 new headsets have been installed. Field Day operations included CW operations in the radio room, SSB operations in the big room, GOTA station in the garage bay and satellite operations from the shed. Several members participated in the K2D Annual Special Event Station Activation from the radio room. The full Station Activity Manager's report is available upon request.

<u>Standing Committees</u>, the July 27 activity will be the annual 'Lark in the Park'. The September Activity Meeting will be 'Practical Information Regarding Test Equipment in the Ham Shack' by Alan Wolke W2AEW. The Repeater committee reported a brief telephone line outage.

Other Activities, Reports of activities of other club groups included activities of the CW Class, Contest Activations, Castle Craig 10-10 and KeyKlix. Rick KC1OYN reported on the upcoming Big E and opportunities to participate. The club will have a flea market 23 July from 9AM till noon to sell some extra club gear. Ray KC1QLS reported on the progress of the weather balloon project and his submission of a grant to the ARRL to help fund the project. The Nutmeg Hamfest is on track for 8 Oct. The Constitution/Bylaws Revision Committee has nearly completed the review of submitted change suggestions. The revised document will be distributed to the membership before one or two town hall meetings will be scheduled in August where the members can discuss any concerns. After the required month waiting period the membership will vote to accept the revisions in September. All the dates will be announced in advance.

<u>Continuing Business</u> The monthly VE Sessions continue to attract multiple examinees including walk-ins. WARG/EMCOM has monthly training sessions for CERT and there will not be a fall CERT Training Class in the fall because of conflict with the Ham Radio Classes and Health Department training at the OEM. Perhaps there will be CERT Classes after the first of the year. The CERT Team will have the trailer at Community Lake in support of the town Health Department Expo on August 12.

<u>Wallingford Amateur Radio Group</u> Rob K1RCT made a motion, "to change our 501(c) name to 'Meriden Amateur Radio Club d/b/a Wallingford Amateur Radio Group'". The motion was made and seconded. Members made comments in favor and in opposition to the motion following which it was tabled. Dale NA1L rephrased the concept to explain that the legal entity club name would remain Meriden Amateur Radio Club Inc. MARC would then file the paper work with the town of Wallingford to make the declaration to the town that we will be doing business as d/b/a The Wallingford Amateur Radio Group, WARG in Wallingford. NA1L offered to do some initial casual investigation into the possible consequences such as taxes and registrations. W1YSM made a motion to formally engage NA1L for this process. The motion was made and seconded followed by a vote, 3 NAY, 34 YEA and 1 abstention.

<u>Projects (New and Continuing)</u>, the 6 months report of the MARCONI Project has been submitted to the ARRL. K1RCT is working the satellite project documentation. There is currently \$748 remaining in that grant. 8 Oct will be the YMCA 5K with need for 6 to 8 volunteers.

The online holiday party poll resulted in 13 in favor with 4 opposed and an even split over location. Voting Summary for the April meeting

Four new applicants were each approved for membership. Kenneth Jalbert KB1FEX, Julian LoRusso KC1STF, Silas Moeckel K1SMD and Mark White KC1TEV.

A vote to approve \$500 for Field Day and Lark in the Park food was approved by majority with 2 nay votes.

NA1L was approved to investigate to issues around MARC adopting a d/b/a WARG by a vote of 3 NAY, 34 YEA and 1 abstention.
