






Again, I'll make my pitch to those that will listen. Can MARC ever become a quasi-contesting club? This club has many irons in the fire but with a roster approaching 150 one would conclude that the club would have 25+ people active in all club activities. Fox hunting draws out the same 10 or so people. Field Day brings out 15 or so people (maybe this year will be different). Saturday 'Elmering' has the same 12 or so folks show up. Contesting participation within MARC draws out 5 or less members to play radio for a weekend.

Contesting attracted me to MARC back in 2014 and I had great fun with Field Day that year (including refueling the generator at midnight with just a cell phone LED for illumination). I think that year the SSB, under Jim N1ZN, scored in the 400 range while the CW folks (KKF and VDF with others) scored into the

800 range. While FD is no contest, it trains amateur radio operators for preparedness in the event of an emergency. Contesting does that to a degree as well and tests the operators ability to clearly copy messages, albeit most are short, correctly and score your participation with other amateur radio operators.

A few days ago I received an email from WARCA (World Amateur Radio Contesting Association) which is a non-profit organization who promotes amateur radio contesting especially among youth. W3UA, W1AAU, VA2WA are just a few of the folks organizing this and promoting this group which was founded in 2019. I didn't know of this organization until I receive the email informing me of my ranking as a contester (I feel so privileged – hi hi). So I went to the URL included in the email (<u>https://www.warca.org/</u>) and decided to run through our MARC roster to see who else is on the list. Here is the tabulation;

It seems we have more contesting folks in MARC than previously thought. Seventeen members participated in at least one contest over the past year. It's no surprise (to me) N1API ranks at the top in our club. The2022-2023 has 63,322 rankings and that places Al in the top 10% of the contesters that the

WARCA tracks. Review these scores and compare them with the likes of Dave Sumner (former CEO of the ARRL – K1ZZ), where Dave placed #39 (top 1%)!

The purpose of this memo was to bring to light Amateur Radio contesting and highlight those members that do actively participate in contesting activities. Congratulations to MARC members honed their radio operating skills by participated in a contest over the past year. 73.

As mentioned the other day, we are operating the IARU HF World Championship contest as a public demonstration on the shore of our lake. As you can see in one of the photos, we are entertaining some of the local fishermen. As the day gets going, the lake will be full with folks on their rafts, paddle boards, and various sail crafts -- and we look forward to engaging their curiosity about amateur radio! FYI, you'll note we're using our homebrew, fishing-pole-based, wire Moxon. Thanks to its superb cardioid pattern, resulting in an amazing F/B ratio, it is the best 20m beam in our arsenal -- even beating our three-element Mosley. It's our primary 20m contest antenna. The rig is our trusty Yaesu FT-840 that we purchased in 1999. We bring out this classic for public demonstrations because of its nice, big tuning display. And it still puts out a great signal!
