The President's Net Control Corner

MARC: MOVING INTO 2020 AND BEYOND (PART II)

Over the past few weeks I have heard club members make the following remarks: "I joined MARC because amateur radio is my hobby. I want my participation in MARC to be fun – not work." Another remark I heard was," why should I attend Business Meetings, mostly we argue and rarely get anything done – I ask myself --why am I here"? These remarks likely express feelings we all have had over the years – I know I have had them. In this month's column I will continue to enumerate/discuss changes that have occurred in the Meriden Amateur Radio Column over the past few years that I believe are helping make MARC a more friendly, fair, productive, fun and enjoyable radio club.

- V. XYL/YL Committee: I have been told that the world is made of two types of people- lumpers and splitters. I guess I am a "splitter" since I keep making new committees. I established this Committee to make a clear statement that women are welcome and encouraged to participate in MARC. While most amateur radio-activities are gender-neutral, this Committee was established to let women know that should they wish to establish their own contest or an activity they want to call their own, the MARC leadership will be supportive and make resources available for that activity. As of now that Committee is quiet, but nevertheless, it is there if, and as, the women wish to use it.
- VI. <u>Posting the Agenda On-Line</u>: One request I received at the start of my administration was to please make the Agenda available on-line before the meeting, so members could consider key issues to be addressed as well as review any motions to be voted on at the business meeting. Accordingly, I post the Agenda usually on the Monday before the Business meeting. This I hope helps to make MARC more transparent and will allow members to feel more prepared and informed, for the Business Meeting, as they will know important issues to be addressed, in advance.
- VII. SKYWARN: I am the EC for SKYWARN for New Haven and Middlesex Counties. I am also the NCS for the Weather Net (or SKYWARN Net when there is inclement weather) on Thursdays at 1900 ET on W1WPD 442.500 DCS 073 linked to W1BCG 145.29 (PL 110.9). The SKYWARN AEC is Steve KC1SA. Thus, MARC is able to provide the SKYWARN leadership for New Haven/Middlesex Counties. This increases our visibility and influence with the National Weather Service in Upton. That the SKYWARN Training Program is scheduled for this May 8th at our Club site at the OEM, reflects this relationship. If any club member wishes to learn how to become a NCS for SKYWARN let me know. This is another area that will help to expand MARC's influence, state-wide.
- VIII. Leadership Meeting: I realized that to be the best President I could be, I needed input and guidance from Club officers. Upon reflection, I decided to set up a meeting of Club officers and some Club advisors on the Sunday before the Business Meeting. We meet from 8:30am to 11:00am at the OEM and discuss club policy and reflect on the pros and cons of the topics I bring to the group. In the past few months, we have discussed Club liability issues, how the \$100 petty cash issue should be addressed, merging WARG into MARC as a standing committee and other substantive topics. No binding decisions are made on Sundays, since only the Club can make such determinations. However, if a club member wishes to discuss a specific topic with the group, I am open to having that member attend that Sunday meeting. No Agenda for this meeting will be published but be assured the topics will be of importance. This is not a technical/radio repair clinic, nor is it a didactic/educational session. It is designed to deal with programmatic and political/administrative issues. While it sounds dry, the coffee and often donuts we bring adds needed moisture and sweetness to the meeting. I find the session very helpful and the input provided is often brought forward to the Business Meeting on the following Thursday.

As mentioned above, these changes are made in an effort to make MARC a more inclusive and enjoyable amateur radio club. I believe that unless attention is paid to the needs and wishes of the membership, the Club will cease to be a welcoming enjoyable entity, and then eventually, it may just cease to exist. I consider the number of members who attend the Business and Activities meetings and even the Christmas party, as a reflection and affirmation of the Club officers' leadership. The trick for us as Officers, is to make a difficult job-- that is a lot of work ---look like fun. To paraphrase NYC Mayor Ed Koch's famous phrase, uttered in the 1980's.... "How we doing?"

Secretary Report & Minutes of the Meriden Amateur Radio Club Dave Tipping NZ1J, Secretary

BUSINESS MEETING, APRIL 11, 2019

Meeting was called to order at 19:30 EDT by President W1YSM

Introductions / Members Present: Introductions were made by 25 members in attendance.

Announcements:

W1YSM has begun a three part series in Key Klix that describes changes the club has made recently and brings up ideas to consider in the future.

The business meetings are planned to move along a little more quickly and to take no more than 75 minutes.

Secretary's Report:

The March Business Meeting minutes were published in the April Key Klix and were accepted.

The club received our Radio Equipment Insurance Policy.

Treasurer's Report:

K1WJL gave a Treasurer's Report which was accepted.

The \$75 cost of the Radio Equipment Insurance Policy, which has been renewed, was approved.

The \$320 cost of the Liability Insurance Policy, which is due to renew, was approved.

Station Manager's Report:

We are in the process of changing from a private email reflector to the new club reflector.

K1RCT resolved a PC issue at the SSB station on 4/6/2019.

The Town has freed up some funds that will allow us to procure a headset, headset adapters, and PolyPhaser products for the VHF antenna.

Activity Committee: The April topic will be Amateur Radio and Rocketry. A SKYWARN session is scheduled for May 8th. Members of the Salem Amateur Radio Club will visit in May.

Saturday Mornings: About 18 people visit the club on Saturday mornings. N1AKN's troubleshooting and repair bench continues to be popular.

Station Activations: K1RCT reports that our contest calendar is still being refined. We will operate from the EOC for Field Day at the end of June. We'd like to have better signs than we've had in the past to let the public know that we're operating during Field Day.

Nets: K1VDF's 10 meter net, N1ZN's 6 meter net, and K1TDO's 2 meter net continue to get between 4 and 14 check-ins each week. The Nutmeg Net is currently on the 147.36 repeater four nights per week.

Castle Craig: The summer QSO Party will be the first weekend in August.

Scholarship: We're waiting for applications and expect to receive some before the deadline.

Membership: We have 72 members paid through the end of 2019.

Interference and Technical: No issues were reported

VE and Instruction:

KC1SA was voted in as co-VEC.

N1GNV plans for the 'Tech in a Day' program to run in July.

Members are encouraged to become VE's.

Nutfest: The Nutmeg Hamfest is planned for October 13 at the Sheraton Four Points. We are applying to the ARRL to have the State Convention at the Nutmeg Hamfest.

Key Klix: K1WJL welcomes any articles and photos. Again, our Editor/Publisher has done a great job producing an excellent newsletter.

EMCOM / AUXCOM: We have enough volunteers for the Cheshire MS Walk. There is a 2 day Auxcom session sponsored by the Department of Homeland Security and the Connecticut State Police on June 8th and 9th.

Social Media: KC1SA is handling the club Facebook page.

YL/XYL Committee: K1STM will setup a conference call for the committee.

Candy Store: The club website has details about Gold Medal Ideas and MARC clothing and badges.

Old Business:

K1LHO's proposed motion to authorize one-time expenditures that do not exceed \$100 was withdrawn.

It was determined to be unnecessary.

The amount of \$35 per year was authorized to upgrade the website to HTTPS.

The amount of \$37.95 was authorized to reimburse K1RCT for a Tigertronics cable and jumper module.

New Business:

A motion was approved that states: "The MARC Station Manager shall be awarded and authorized to control a budget of \$100 to cover payment for needed infrastructural radio-related items or radio services at his/her discretion. The Station Manager will report on and thereby notify the club members of all such expenditures at the next business meeting. This discretionary fund will be replenished back to the \$100 limit following approval of the club members attending the business meeting."







