The proposed CQ Santa Event is not original but contacting Santa by Amateur Radio is new to MARC and the Town of Wallingford. As conceived, we will need multiple club members and the distaff side of the club – YLs, XYLs and significant others, to help provide a truly warm and welcoming environment for the children - who can choose to contact Santa or Mrs. Claus. I envision several of us will be clad in red and white Santa hats, with candy canes and chocolate Santa's available as well as healthy snacks and drinks. No one needs to, or should, dress up as ELF – and No Reindeer ----PLEASE.

The radios will likely be set up in the main room in two different areas one for Santa and one for Mrs. Claus. I foresee some Christmas decorations -- perhaps a modest Christmas tree (and maybe a Menorah?). Likely we will use the W1KKF repeater and a simplex frequency. The disembodied voices of Santa and the Mrs. will be on the other end of the transmissions, ensconced in their respective QTH's.

Once made aware of the event, Town officials responded with strong support. Len Guercia has informed us that as the Lead player, MARC (WARG) will be coordinating this effort with multiple town agencies: MRC, CERT, OEM, Park and Rec, and the Dept of Social Service. The Mayor himself has expressed enthusiasm and may well attend if his schedule permits. That so many Agencies are involved, speaks to the town-wide appeal of this event and the impact it could have. We will be supporting Master's Manna Food bank. The price of admission will be a non-perishable food item to support those town citizens most in need of food for their families during the holiday season. It's a bit late for a toy drive I am told.

We have several media contacts and can expect TV and newspaper coverage of the CQ Santa event. I anticipate that while the younger children negotiate with Santa, or the Mrs., for their gifts, the older children (or adults) might be enticed to learn more about amateur radio and to become involved in the hobby - maybe we can pick up a new member! We will need senior Hams to be present to Elmer the curious and the inquisitive. Here is a chance to make new Hams; we will have brochures at the ready.

Our club should foster various ideals that show its value to its members and its support of the community, MARC is, as it should be, dedicated to: supporting amateur radio as a hobby, advancing radio science, educating and encouraging new amateur hopefuls, both young and old, to get or upgrade their FCC license and importantly to provide friendship and camaraderie to its members. Just come to the OEM on a Saturday morning to see what I am saying in action. Of major importance, additionally, is the need for MARC to provide a return on the investment the Town and the Community have made in the OEM facility and in some much needed improvements to the Club's infrastructure including radio equipment and various non-radio hardware items. We in MARC, have much to be thankful for.

This event will engender good will, good feelings, good publicity and provide a strong return to the town's investment in us. It's the right event for the right reason, during the right season and with MARC, the right Amateur Radio Club, in the Lead. Through CQ Santa, MARC/WARG will show itself to be a credit to our hobby, to our town, and to ourselves. Seems like a win-win-win. Santa would be proud.


