





Charles Darwin (1809-1882) the Naturalist and Biologist is best known for his work on the Science of Evolution. His work related to the evolution of plants and animals. <u>Secretary's Report:</u> The July Business Meeting minutes were published in the August Key Klix and were accepted.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> K1WJL presented the Treasurer's Report, which was accepted.

Station Manager's Report: The Dune Star has been repaired and is back in service. Jeff, N1AKN, repaired the Astron power supply. The log-periodic antenna is now available at both HF stations. Each station now uses an external antenna tuner. A 6 meter beam is now connected to the FT-991a on the VHF bench. We're still waiting for a quote for the antenna, boom mount, and headset adapter that the Town will purchase

Activity Committee: The August Activity Meeting will be Jeopardy for Hams.

Saturday Mornings: About 18 people visit the club on Saturday mornings.

Station Activations: W/VE Islands is August 24th and 25th. We'll be at Fireworks Island on the 24th.


