

PRESIDENT'S COLUMN, NOVEMBER KEY KLIX



WHY DOES OUR CLUB DO SO MUCH???

A Club is defined in many ways. Two of them are: a Club is an organization dedicated to a particular interest or activity; or a Club is a group of people having something in common.

Amateur Radio checks both boxes. That's fine, but why do we do so much? Maybe it's in my DNA to be so busy. I have been told by one member, "I joined MARC to just have fun -not get a homework assignment each month." Harsh words, but like most criticism, there is some merit in the thought.

There is an old saying that goes, "To each his own, said the man as he kissed the frog". If there is one thing Amateur Radio operators have in common, it is that they do not have all aspects of ham radio in common. Hams like so many different aspects of amateur radio because there are so many aspects. The hobby is very diverse and eclectic as are MARC member-interests. Our hams are into Antennae Theory and Construction, Kit Building, Contesting, Teaching (Elmering), OnAir Activities, POTA, Fox Hunting, Satellites, SSTV, CERT, WARG, Road Race Security, Nets, EMMCOM/AUXCOM, SKYWARN, ARES, Nutfest, Code, Passing Traffic, Flea Marketing, Constructing Arduino Circuits, Electronic Theory, Politics, Rag Chewing, Radio Repair, Running VE Sessions, etc., etc.

When I became aware of this wide range of club member interests, I decided to try to offer a little something for everyone. Accordingly, Saturday morning (pre-pandemic) at the OEM, was a beehive of activity as members came to do their own thing- often with a few likeminded souls. Keeping this wide range of activity going is no mean feat. That MARC has a spectrum of activities is apparent not only to the club's members, but it is also apparent to new hams or more senior hams searching to join a Club that "does stuff". Well, if there is one thing MARC does, it's STUFF. What is needed is someone or a group of members, to step up and take the lead in one of these areas.

Seems to me, if someone loves the code, perhaps they would be willing to hold periodic sessions for new hams on learning the Morse Code. Similarly, if someone loves to contest, we have radios and antennae and chairs in our radio room. Sharing knowledge and teaching new hams about what you love about the hobby is one of the joys of being in an active club. Some feel we are getting too big. I respectfully, disagree. The more different activities we offer, the more likely we are to attract new members. And new (young) members are the lifeblood of a Club. Clubs that turn inward and do not offer new prospects a wide range of activities to choose from are doomed to extinction.

MARC is currently, the opposite of inward – we are outward facing. I try to provide and foster some activity for everyone to enjoy. Not everyone needs to do everything. It seems to be working, we now have 118 members. Spread the word, we are a very active club. Now, has anyone seen my pet frog?

Meeting was called to order by President Ed Snyder, W1YSM at 19:30 EDT

Announcements (W1YSM), We will continue to follow the OEM occupancy rules as determined by the town. If you are NOT fully vaccinated then mask are required otherwise they are optional. The 2021 Xmas Party has been cancelled following the results of a membership survey. There will be a special one hour Zoom meeting on December 2 from 7:30 to 8:30 PM to consider how we use various forms of social media and conduct hybrid business meetings starting in January 2022. The Year in Review Activities Meeting will be December 9 on Zoom at 7:30PM.

<u>Secretary's Report</u> (N1BRL) September meeting minutes were approved by majority vote. One membership applicant, Preston Byrne KC1HQX, was presented and approved by majority vote.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (K1WJL) was read by Dave. The complete Treasure's report is available to members upon request. <u>Station Manager's Report</u> (K1RCT) The station account password was updated. The station computer operating systems and application software were updated. The Station Activity Manager received club recognition for the US Islands QSO Party. The SAM report is available upon request.

Standing Committees and working groups

Entertainment/Activities, October will be W3APC talking about the Wallingford power grid. December 2 will be a Special Town hall meeting on MARC and Social Media usage. December 9 will be the Year in Review Activities Meeting. January 27 will be KD9IPO and How to Work a Pile-Up. February will be KB1FYL and Amateur Radio-Astronomy.

Technical, K1RCT had no interference to report.

Scholarship, N1ZN reminded the membership of the availability of the W1FD scholarship.

Publicity, – No report.

Repeater, –The Repeater Committee meets quarterly. At the recent meeting the committee updated the Repeater Plan of Operation. There was a brief EchoLink outage for maintenance.

CLUB OFFICER NOMINATIONS and Elections

Steve, KC1SA, explained this year's voting process will follow the same logic as last year. The current officers were asked if they planned to serve another year if elected and each replied in the affirmative. The membership was asked if there was anyone who wanted to run for office or nominate a member for office. No one was nominated, but Officer Nominations remain open until they close at the November 4th meeting.

The Nov. 4th meeting will be the final opportunity to nominate someone else for office. This meeting will also be the time for members to express their opinions for why and who should be considered for Ham Of the Year and Elmer Of the Year. Only members attending this Nov 4th meeting will be eligible to vote for HOY and EOY.

At the close of this Nov. 4th meeting <u>if the current officers are unopposed</u> then the Secretary will cast a single vote at the Nov. 11th Zoom meeting to place the 2021 officers as the 2022 officers. HOY and EOY voting will be done by an email/online survey sent to those in attendance at the Nov. 4th meeting.

If there are contested officer races at the Nov. 4th meeting then the Nov. 11th meeting will be a live physical meeting at the EOM building to collect voting ballots for officers and votes for HOY and EOY.

<u>Other Activities</u>, A core group of fox hunters go out for the hunt each Sunday along with hunters from other surrounding towns. Parks On The Air is gaining momentum with several activations per week. Many members participating as both activators and hunters. The website gets monthly updates but otherwise is in a holding pattern.

No current club contest activations are planned but N1YLN is expected to return as Contest and Activation Manager.

<u>Club Nets</u>, All the nets continue without new developments. KB1FYL has stepped in occasionally as Net Control for the 2 meter net.

Castle Craig, Details of the Castle Craig Report were published in the recent edition of Key Klix.

<u>Instruction VE /Training.</u> Four people passed their exams at the Oct. VE Session. The next VE Session will be Nov. 13 but there will not be one in December.

<u>WARG/EMCOM/Aux Com</u>, There are Hats and Shirts available to CERT Team Members. A new CERT Class is planned for first quarter of 2022. Prerequisites for the class are completion of IS 100, IS 200, IS 700 and IS 800 online courses. The class is expected to be an online Zoom meeting from 6:30 to 8:30 Wednesday evenings.

Key Klix continues to be one of the best club publications thanks to K1WJL.

<u>New Business</u>, KC1SA explained some of the details about how the club 'Diamond and Gold Challenge' will operate starting in Jan. 2022 and completing in November 2022. Full specifics can be found at the DropBox link that was emailed to the membership previously.

A vote to approve the \$1000 budget for K1RCT to replace the W1NRG laptop computer was affirmed.

A vote to approve an approximately \$225 expenditure for the purchase an 80/40 dipole to replace the failed G5RV antenna was affirmed.

KB1JL will get some free MARC Business Cards to be made available to members to hand out at various club activities as needed.

"SHOW"- Saturday Hands-On Workshop is a concept for some planned/structured activities at the EOC on Saturday mornings in addition to our free form open house was offered by W1YSM.

Necessary A/V equipment was discussed and how to conduct hybrid business meetings starting in January 2022 was discussed.

Old Business, CQ Santa will follow the same format as last year and we hope to encourage more YL and XYL participation.

The clubs support of Masters Manna will be done in cooperation with the Wallingford Department of Health.

Nobody replied to the request for club officer nominations before closing the meeting.

From the WB1GYZ Files

Bob Biancur WB1GYZ

N1JEO JOEL CURNEAL





Joel Curneal N1JEO, was born in Milo, Maine, and began his schooling in a one-room schoolhouse in the town of Passadumaeag; a Penobscot Indian word meaning "quick water". By 2010 the census surged to 374.

Back about 1991 Joel attended a computer show that also offered the no-code amateur radio license test. Relying on his electronics background he decided to take the test without preparation, passed, and the result was sent to MARC.

MARC, losing no time, reached out and Joel subsequently became a member. He learned CW, upgraded to Extra, became VP of the club and took charge of VE sessions. He enjoys instructing and in that capacity has provided learning sessions for anyone wishing to advance their knowledge of electronics. He was voted Elmer of the year 12 times. After a hiatus of several years Joel recently returned to MARC and to the hobby. He is an avid experimenter, antenna builder, and QRP enthusiast.

Joel has worked in the rubber manufacturing field for 55 years and continues to work part time as a consultant at Jonal labs and JOCU Solutions, Ilc, a company he started. He specializes in finding solutions to problems with aeronautical rubber related products. Joel belongs to the rubber division of the American Chemical Society, and was recently presented with a special recognition award, an encapsulated 1891 gold plated Morgan Silver dollar presented at the International Elastomers Conference, for having the longest service record at the conference.

Joel has designed a unique battery voltage monitoring device that uses a combination of four color LED's to indicate state of charge. Joel explained that Lithium battery packs employ circuitry to shut down the battery when voltage drops below a critical value. Sealed lead acid batteries typically do not have that feature. He feels that LED's provide a more noticeable alert than an easily overlooked voltmeter for protecting equipment. He is willing to provide parts, programming, and instruction for building this meter at nominal cost. Joel figures about two hours of instruction and hands-on construction should make for a fun and useful Saturday project.

The Marathon Challenge 75th MARC Anniversary Get On The Air



Background:

The Marathon Challenge, a follow on yearly contest that MARC started via Dan Murphy. The challenge was last held around 2012 or 2013 and was and is intended to get the MARC membership on the air, participate in club events and generally to get members more active with Amateur Radio and MARC.

Duration:

The Challenge begins January 1, 2022 and will conclude October 31, 2022, so consider this a contesting event during the 75th Anniversary year of the Meriden Amateur Radio Club. The 75th Anniversary gifts are generally represented by Gold or Diamonds, hence the diamonds and gold bars on these pages.

Scoring and challenges of fairness to all participants:

All bands are game (HF, 6m, 2m & 70cm) with this contest however some MARC members only have Technician Amateur Radio licenses. To make the contest fairer the Tech licensed folks get a 1.5X handicap; any scoring achieved for a given month is multiplied by 1.5. In addition, since Tech folks are limited to UHF, VHF, 6m and 10m (for the most part), those bands get a 5X kicker for everyone. [QSOs made on those bands are worth 5X points (for any license holder)]. The intent is to get more folks on 6m and 10m and to promote UHF/VHF simplex contacts.

Some modes aren't allowed. Modes like DMR and Echolink aren't part of this contest nor are QSOs via a repeater also are not counted. In the spirit of this event a repeater QSO will not be counted except for Net Check-ins (more on that in the Club Participation section).

Club Participation

MARC is 110 members strong, so a fairly large group of Amateur Radio operators. Civil preparedness, Fox hunting, Contesting, POTA, Weather Nets, informal 2m, 6m and 10m Nets are all events held by MARC. You will get points for participating in these events. Again, Technician licensed folks get that 1.5X kicker too.

Logging

It is recommended you keep a log just in case questions arise. A single excel spreadsheet is required to be submitted by 10AM the morning of each MARC business meeting from February through November 2022, the first sheet is due February 10th and the last will be due November 10th. If you don't have access to excel then simply input the information into the blank sheet and logging officials will enter data on your behalf. The excel sheet is protected so only some areas can be modified by you and score calculation is automatic via excel. All monthly sheets should be sent to KC1SA (sallen48@gmail.com) for tabulation

Summary and awards

At MARC business meetings tallies will be read highlighting number of participants, QSOs made and by band. At the 2022 Holiday party accolades will be awarded to; Highest score, Highest club participation, Most band – QSOs worked, Most members worked (could be a tie), Most DX contacts

Three experience levels

Rookies – licensed less than 3 years Seasoned – licensed 3 or more years but less than 6 years Experienced – licensed 6 or more years.

License class handicap

Extra & General class license holders get a 1X handicap Technician class license holders get a 1.5X handicap

Excluded from contest

Net check-ins except for the 2m, 6m and 10m MARC Nets and WX Net, Repeater contacts, Echolink, DMR

Included in contest

MARC member to member QSO on UHF, VHF, HF excluding use of repeaters, RTTY, PSK, CW, SSTV, SSB, JT/FT

Band scoring


UHF, VHF, 6m and 10m with no repeater use are worth 5 points each 12m through 160m are worth 1 point each

Club participation events

Fox hunting (fox or hunter) are worth 5 points for each attended event
POTA (activations not hunters) are worth 5 points for each attended event
6m, 10m, 2m weekly MARC net check-in and WX Net Thursday check-in are worth 5 points for each.
Field Day, Castle Craig QSO party, other MARC contesting participation is worth 15 points.
Club Call Sign QSO with W1NRG, W1FD, W1WRG is worth 4 points for each contact

Miscellaneous

All MARC member to member QSOs have 5X multiplier
Summary score sheet to be submitted to KC1SA by the morning of the monthly business meeting (10AM).
Tally will be presented at business meeting from February through November 2022
Contest will begin January 1, 2022 and end October 31, 2022
Contesting QSOs can be used for this event.



The above is an example sheet. I filled in my personal information for the report of January. Most cells in the spreadsheet are locked, the GREEN data areas are unlocked and that's where you put your data.

I QSO'd with 5 members and 30 DX's with non-members. I contacted two of the MARC stations twice in January, participated in a fox hunt, checked in twice on the 2m, 10m and WX net and three times on the 6m net. If a 10-10 QSO party or Field Day event happened and I participated it would be logged under Club Contesting.
